Back to the Classics

In their first garden, the Ridaughts sought to display their budding collection of daylilies with perennials and other shrubs to stunning effect. Soon, a daylily farm emerged, with Jerome designing and planting and Reba taking orders.

"I'm the brains, and he's the brawn!" Reba said, laughing. Their garden design is inspired the classical gardens they have seen in Europe, where both symmetry and sculpture play an important role in landscape. Inspired by Monet and other painterly gardens, they commissioned a steel-framed arch to be a centerpiece in the formal garden.

Notes from a Country Garden

Jerome and Reba Ridaught have worked hard to make their place a sanctuary. "I always wanted a place to design and plant," said Jerome. Drawing from years in the antiques and floral design business, Jerome would sometimes stay up late to sketch different garden scenarios.
