Romantic Hanging Container Gardens — Try mixing various types of blooming plants with trailing foliage plants and you'll achieve a romantic feel. A good potting soil mix with moisture control additives and the largest containers you can find will keep your hanging baskets from drying out.

Bird Baths — Create an intimate setting with a bird bath as a focal point, surrounded by native irises and boxwood edging.

Begonias are vigorous growers that make dependable patio container plants in the shade. More tolerant of humid heat than most any other begonia, this tropical beauty should be treated like an annual, though sometimes cutting them back will rejuvenate them for a second year of growth and bloom.
